Information Should Create Understanding

The challenge is rarely the absence of information.

More often, it is transforming information into understanding.

Reports may exist in multiple locations.

Data may require significant effort to assemble.

Teams may spend valuable time reconciling information rather than acting upon it.

The goal is not simply collecting information. The goal is developing a clearer understanding of the agency and its mission.

When information supports understanding, leadership gains a stronger foundation for decision-making.
